## Radiologic Technologist (RT)

If an educational program offered by Mercy College is designed to meet or is advertised as meeting the educational requirements for a specific professional license or certification which is required for employment in the related profession, then Mercy must inform prospective and enrolled student of the following:

- 1. Each state in which the curriculum of the educational program meets the educational requirements for licensure or certification
- 2. Each state in which the curriculum of the educational program does not meet the educational requirements for licensure or certification
- 3. Each state in which the institution has not made a determination on whether the curriculum of the educational program meets the educational requirements for licensure or certification

In addition to the general disclosure identified above, if while taking courses at Mercy College a prospective student or enrolled student will be located in a state where the educational program does not meet or where the College has not made a determination on whether the curriculum meets the educational requirements, then Mercy College must provide the prospective student or enrolled student with personal, written notice.
