Tuition and fees listed below are for the academic year identified above with an effective date even with the first billing date of the 2023 summer term quarter. Tuition and fees are subject to change. Changes impacting the current academic year will be reflected in a separate appendix with the effective date prominently disclosed. An Appendix A for each future academic year will be included in each catalog. Each student will incur and be responsible for paying the tuition and fees disclosed in the Tuition and Fee Appendix A for each respective academic year in which the student is enrolled.

Regular Tuition

Legacy Tuition (per credit hour for all hours attempted):

The legacy tuition is calculated on a per credit hour basis and covers all undergraduate programs and all undergraduate course enrollments **EXCEPT** courses offered through MercyPLUS and those required to earn the Accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree and the Paramedic degree (tuition for the excepted courses and degrees are described below). The tuition is charged on a per credit hour basis for all hours attempted.

Accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing Tuition (per credit hour)

The Accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing (ABSN) program tuition is calculated on a per credit hour basis and covers nursing courses which have the naming format (NUA-####) <u>and</u> Servant Leadership (SVL-285). The curriculum is based on a total of 120 total credit hours; 49 credits of nursing coursework (NUA-####), 3 credit hours of Servant Leadership (SVL-285) and 68 credit hours of general education coursework.

<u>Voluntary and Required Repeats</u> - Any student who repeats any of the ABSN required courses or Servant Leadership for any reason will incur tuition charges equal to the number of credit hours repeated multiplied by the ABSN credit hour rate.

<u>Non-ABSN Courses</u> - Any student who elects to enroll in general education coursework in addition to the required ABSN program and servant leadership courses will incur additional tuition at the Legacy Tuition rate described above.

Graduate Tuition (per credit hour)

Tuition for all graduate degrees is calculated on a per credit hour basis for each graduate level course attempted.

Paramedic Program Tuition (3-term):

The Paramedic tuition only applies to and covers professional courses required to earn the Paramedic certificate which use the **EMS**-### course number format.

Any student who is required to or elects to repeat any **EMS**-### course or takes any course not required to earn the Paramedic Certificate will incur additional tuition charged equal to the number of credit hours repeated or taken at the Legacy Tuition rate described above.

The Paramedic Program Tuition is billed in three equal installments. Each installment payment is due on or before the first day of each respective term. Tuition is considered fully earned by the College as specified in the Tuition Adjustment Policies Section of the Mercy College of Health Sciences, College Catalog. If a

student drops or withdrawals and financial aid must be returned to the government, the student is personally responsible for the full amount of the resulting unpaid tuition.

Undergraduate Audit Tuition (per credit hour):

Tuition charged when neither a letter grade nor academic credit is awarded by the College and when enrollment in the course is reflected on the student's transcript. This rate applies to all courses except those offered through MercyPLUS. See the Academic Policies and Procedures Section of the Catalog for more information.

Graduate Audit Tuition (per credit hour):

Tuition charged when neither a letter grade nor academic credit is awarded by the College and when enrollment in the course is reflected on the student's transcript. This rate applies to all graduate courses. See the Academic Policies and Procedures Section of the Catalog for more information.

10-week Quarter Tuition:

The 10-week tuition structure allows the student to attempt one (1) to twelve (12) credit hours in each 10-week quarter. Effective **01/01/2024**, the only program that admits students to a 10-week quarter and utilizes this tuition structure is the RN-to-BSN program. The 10-week Quarter Tuition covers the professional program courses which use the **NSG-4##** course number format. Any professional program course named in a manner which is inconsistent with the format described in this paragraph is not included in the flat fee tuition structure and will utilize the Legacy Tuition rate described above.

GRANDFATHER PROVISION: Students who started the MA, PH and HCA programs before 01/01/2024 and who were charged 10-week Quarter Tuition will continue to be charged 10-week Quarter Tuition for each enrollment period that starts **<u>before</u>** 07/01/2024. All MA, PH and HCA students who were previously charged the 10-week Quarter Tuition will transition to the applicable Legacy Tuition or program-specific tuition rates for any term starting on and after 07/01/2024.

Medical Assistant (MA) Program Tuition

The MA Program Tuition only applies to and covers professional courses required to earn the MA certificate which use the **MA**-### course number format.

Any student who is required to or elects to repeat any MA-### course or takes any course not required to earn the MA Certificate will incur additional tuition charged equal to the number of credit hours repeated or taken at the Legacy Tuition rate described above.

The MA Program Tuition is billed in three equal installments. Each installment payment is due on or before the first day of each respective term. Tuition is considered fully earned by the College as specified in the Tuition Adjustment Policies Section of the Mercy College of Health Sciences, College Catalog. If a student drops or withdrawals and financial aid must be returned to the government, the student is personally responsible for the full amount of the resulting unpaid tuition.

Certificate Tuition

Emergency Medical Technician Certificate

Tuition rate applied when a student enrolls in the Emergency Medical Technician course offered on the Mercy College Campus. A student may elect to take this course for six academic credit. If a student elects to take the course for credit, the business-office policies which normally govern short-term certificates are not applicable, but instead, all for-credit policies, including tuition and fee amounts will apply.

Critical Care Paramedic Certificate

Tuition rate applied for the course leading to the endorsement as a Critical Care Paramedic (CCP). A student may elect to take this course for academic credit. If a student elects to take the course for credit, the business-office policies which normally govern short-term certificates are not applicable, but instead, all for-credit policies, including tuition and fee amounts will apply.

Advanced Emergency Medical Technician Certificate

Tuition rate applied when a student enrolls in the Advanced Emergency Medical Technician (AEMT) course. The AEMT certificate is a course where an existing EMT will expand their knowledge, skills, and abilities. The course focuses on emergency care but has content covering medical and traumatic emergencies, adult and pediatric patients, acute and chronic medical conditions, intravenous therapy, and pharmacology. A student may elect to take this course for academic credit. If a student elects to take the course for credit, the business-office policies which normally govern short-term certificates are not applicable, but instead, all for-credit policies, including tuition and fee amounts will apply.

Medical Billing and Coding Certificate

This 10-week, entry-level Medical Billing and Coding (MBC) course is intended for individuals interested in a career in an outpatient clinic, specialty clinic or insurance setting utilizing CPT, ICD-10-CM and HCPCS codes.

Community Health Worker Certificate (CHW-103)

Our Community Health Worker certificate program is a 10-week course, offered 100% online. The program is designed with a behavioral/mental health emphasis, learners are trained in crisis prevention and intervention and gain a broader understanding of the ethnic and racial disparities that lead to chronic disease, mental illness, and social determinants of health.

Certificate Tuition Notice

Full Payment for all certificate courses is due at the time of registration and is non-refundable after the first day of class. Deferred payment plans are not offered by the College for certificate programs. Students are not considered registered until Full Payment is received.

If a student is unable to attend any class, the student has a duty to contact the instructor prior to the class to discuss the matter. If a student fails to attend the first class and has not contacted the instructor prior to the class to obtain permission, the student will be administratively dropped from the class by the College and the amount paid by the student will be refunded. If a student wishes to drop a course and receive a tuition adjustment, the student must submit all completed paperwork to the Registrar on or before the first day of class.

The election to take the certificate course for credit must be made by the student at the time of registration. After the class has started this choice is irrevocable.

Academic Fees

ASN Admissions Assessment Math Examination:

This exam is intended for students who need to demonstrate mathematical competency to satisfy the math requirement for the ASN admissions prerequisite.

ASN Material Fee (charged terms 1 & 2):

Each ASN student will be charged a fee to cover supplies and materials issued or made available to the student to help prepare for successful completion of the NCLEX-RN licensure exam. This fee will cover, but is not limited to NCLEX review materials provided online or on paper, supplemental education aids provided online or on paper and any disposable supplies issued to or used by students as part of a nursing course with a lab component. The fee will be charged to each student two times in the amount shown.

BSN Material Fee (charged in terms 1 & 2):

Each BSN student (excluding RN to BSN and Accelerated BSN students) will be charged a fee to cover supplies and materials issued or made available to the student to help prepare for successful completion of the NCLEX-RN licensure exam. This fee will cover, but is not limited to NCLEX review materials provided online or on paper, supplemental education aids provided online or on paper and any disposable supplies issued to or used by students as part of a nursing course with a lab component. The fee will be charged to each student two times in the amount shown.

Accelerated BSN Material Fee (charged in terms 1, module A) & term 2, module A): \$800.00

Each Accelerated BSN student will be charged a fee to cover supplies and materials issued or made available to the student to help prepare for successful completion of the NCLEX-RN licensure exam. This fee will cover, but is not limited to NCLEX review materials provided online or on paper, supplemental education aids provided online or on paper and any disposable supplies issued to or used by students as part of a nursing course with a lab component. The fee will be charged to each student two times in the amount shown.

Challenge Examination:

Students, who believe they are knowledgeable in certain subject areas and wish to receive college credit for this knowledge, may challenge the course by sitting for the Challenge Examination. Not all courses at Mercy College are available for students to challenge. If a CLEP exam is available for a course, the student may only take the CLEP exam and may not challenge the course. Mercy College will award credit hours through Challenge Examinations provided that the student achieves at least 80 percent on the test in question. The student must pay the Challenge Examination fee prior to taking the Challenge Examination.

Nursing Program Clinical and Lab Make-up:

Nursing students who miss a clinical or lab experience and must make it up at a later date will be assessed this fee. The fee must be paid prior to attending the make-up session. If the fee is not paid, the student will be precluded from attending that session.

Allied Health and Liberal Arts and Sciences Clinical and Lab Make-up:

Students who miss a clinical or lab experience and must make it up at a later date will be assessed this fee. The fee must be paid prior to attending the make-up session. If the fee is not paid, the student will be precluded from attending that session.

Diagnostic Medical Sonography Fee (Each Term):

Students enrolled in Diagnostic Medical Sonography major will be assessed a fee each term due to additional costs associated with the major that are not captured in the normal tuition rate.

Placement Examination:

A fee will be assessed when a placement examination is administered. The placement examination will be administered for the purpose of appropriately placing the student within the appropriate sequence of courses.

Radiologic Technology Material Fee:

Students entering the first term of the Radiologic Technology major will be charged a fee to cover supplies and materials that will be issued to the student.

Radiologic Technology AART Exam Preparation Material Fee (charged in term 5): \$150.00

Students enrolled in the Radiologic Technology major will be charged a fee to cover the cost of review materials and registration to help increase the likelihood of passing the AART Exam.

Administrative Fees

Installment Payment Plan Participation Fee:

A student may elect to participate in an installment payment plan with the College. In order to enter into an installment payment plan, the student must complete the following on or before the first day of each term: (i) pay 25% of the total tuition and fees due, (ii) pay the participation fee and (iii) execute an installment payment plan agreement. The College will allow the student to pay the remaining balance due in no more than three equal installment payments over the term.

All terms and conditions of the installment payment plan will be stated in the plan document. Students who fail to comply with the terms of an installment payment plan, or who have made a late payment to the College or who have issued a check to the College that has been returned for insufficient funds may be prohibited from entering into an installment payment plan for subsequent terms. Installment payment plans are not available to students enrolled in non-credit certificate courses.

Diploma Replacement:

A fee is charged for a replacement diploma.

Graduation:

A fee is charged in the final semester of a student's academic degree or certificate to cover the costs associated with commencement ceremony activities and is required from all graduating students, whether the student attends the ceremony or not.

Late Fee:

In any term in which Full Payment of all tuition and fees is not received by the due date a late payment will be assessed. See Financial Information section of the College Catalog for more information.

ID Badge Replacement:

A fee is charged to replace a lost or stolen ID badge.

Parking Violations:

A fee may be imposed upon any student who parks in any area on the College main campus or the Mercy Medical Center campus, which is not expressly identified and designated for student use, this includes but is not limited to spots designates as "Guest" spots. In addition, a fee may be imposed upon any student who fails to properly place a valid College parking sticker in his or her car.

NOTE 1: Mercy College Students are **not** permitted to park at 921 6th Avenue, also known as ACE and/or College Hill. If you park at 921 6th, Newbury Living (the building owner) will have your vehicle towed. The vehicle owner will be solely responsible for all towing and impound fees.

<u>NOTE 2</u>: Parking in a spot marked for handicapped persons without the proper state-issued permit is a violation of state law. The College will contact the Des Moines Police Department when violations come to our attention. The vehicle owner will be solely responsible for all towing and impound fees.

Impression Fee for Printing and Copying – Black Ink:

Students who exceed the allocated quantity of free impressions for copying and printing each term will incur an impression fee. A copy or print request that has content on both sides of the sheet of paper will be charged two impressions.

Impression Fee for Printing and Copying – Color Ink:

Students who exceed the allocated quantity of free impressions for copying and printing each term will incur an impression fee. A copy or print request that has content on both sides of the sheet of paper will be charged two impressions. Any copy or printed page that utilizes a colored-ink output device will be charged the colored copy fee for each impression generated by the device regardless of the amount of colored ink used to generate the impression.

Plotter Printer Poster:

Any member of the campus community who wishes to print a single-sided, 3-foot x 4-foot poster will incur this fee regardless of the ink colors or quantity of ink used.

Returned Check:

A fee is charged each time a student's check is returned, whether for non-sufficient funds (NSF) or any other reason. In the event a check is not honored by the drafter's financial institution and if a subsequent attempt to pay tuition and or fees occurs after the payment deadline, a late payment fee may also be imposed. A student who issues a subsequent check to the College that is not honored by the drafter's financial institution (e.g. a second NSF) may not participate in an Installment Payment Plan.

Mercy College Training Center Fees

The Mercy College Training Center offers healthcare continuing education. The Center is located on the garden level of the ACE building, 921 6th Avenue, Des Moines, Iowa 50309. Course offerings may change from time-totime. A list of courses currently offered is available at https://mchs.enrollware.com/schedule.

NREMT Full Exam

Fee incurred when attempting the National Registry for Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) exam. The full exam covers six skills: Patient Assessment - Trauma, Dynamic Cardiology, Static Cardiology, Oral Station Case A, Oral Station Case B, and the Integrated Out-Of-Hospital Scenario.

NREMT Partial Exam

Fee incurred when re-testing 3 or fewer skills on the NREMT exam.

CPR Instructor

This course prepares the participant to teach First Aid and CPR. Instructor credentials earned from this course allow the participant to teach First Aid, BLS, Heartsaver/AED, Heartsaver CPR/AED/First Aid, and Family and Friends CPR.

BLS Provider - Part 1 Initial Course

This course is for individual who have never taken a BLS provider course and for those individual whose certification has expired. The class meets the requirements for CPR certification and for renewal of CPR certification for employees working in the healthcare industry. This is also the required CPR course for students studying to become healthcare providers.

BLS Provider - Part 2 Skills Lab

Student must complete BLS Provider - Initial Course prior to attending this skills lab session. Students are also required to purchase a student manual not included in disclosed fee.

PALS – Pediatric Advanced Life Support - Instructor

Course prepares you to become an instructor in Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS).

PALS – Pediatric Advanced Life Support - Provider

Course designed for healthcare providers who care for critically ill or injured children.

PALS – Pediatric Advanced Life Support - Provider Renewal

This course is designed to renew PALS certification for healthcare providers

PEARS - Pediatric Emergency Assessment, Recognition and Stabilization

This course is designed for healthcare providers who might encounter pediatric patients in their profession but who do not routinely provide care for children with high-acuity illness or injury. This course is NOT intended for those who require credentialing in advanced pediatric skills or who are routinely involved in pediatric resuscitation.

ACLS – Instructor

Course prepares you to become an instructor in Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) and PALS provider.

ACLS – Provider

ACLS is a course designed for healthcare providers who respond to cardiovascular emergencies, and provide advanced care.

ACLS – Provider Renewal

This course is designed to renew a participant's ACLS certification.

ACLS – Experienced Provider

This course is designed for healthcare providers who have certified in ACLS at least twice before.

ACLS – Provider with Obstetrics Emphasis

This course is the traditional ACLS course but with an obstetrics emphasis.

Pediatric Heartsaver® First Aid/CPR/AED

This course is designed to meet the regulatory and credentialed training requirements for child care workers. It is interactive video based, instructor led course that teaches basic first aid, CPR, and AED skills for children. Students are also required to purchase a student manual not included in disclosed fee.

Heartsaver® First Aid

Heartsaver First Aid CPR AED is a classroom, video-based, instructor-led course that teaches students critical skills needed to respond to and manage a first aid, choking or sudden cardiac arrest emergency in the first few minutes until emergency medical services (EMS) arrives.

Advanced Stroke Life Support

This course addresses the prehospital, emergency department, and stroke unit management of patients with acute stroke.

Pre-Hospital Trauma Life Support

This course is designed to improve the quality of trauma care and decrease mortality. The program is based on a prehospital trauma care philosophy, stressing the treatment of the multi-system trauma patient as a unique entity with specific needs.

EMS Instructor

This course prepares students to become EMS instructors. This course meets the requirements for the classroom instruction portion for Iowa EMS Instructor endorsement. Candidates must also attend an IDPH Instructor Endorsement session to complete the process.

Advanced EKG

This course supports the national initiative to improve the quality of care and outcomes in heart attack patients by improving readiness and response to STEMI patients. This course is intended for use by outof-hospital healthcare providers, emergency department personnel and other STEMI providers.

Basic EKG

This eight-hour course is designed for anyone interested in learning basic electrocardiogram (EKG) rhythms and what medications are vital when a patient has a cardiac emergency. No previous education or experience is necessary.

Futuro Community Outreach Fees

Community Health Worker Certificate

Comprised of three courses each delivered in 10-week sessions in a 100% online format. The courses prepare the student to build community relationships and address barriers faced by individuals needing a variety of medical services. The feee is billed in three installments: Installment 1 equal to \$1,600 is due before the first day Community Health Work Foundation 101; Installment 2 equal to \$800 is due before the first day of Community Health 101; Installment 3 equal to \$800 is due before the first day of Community Health Work in Practice 102.

Behavior Health Micro-credential

Comprised of one course delivered in a 10-week session in a 100% online format. The course prepares the student to assist individuals living with behavioral health issues by accessing the proper resources for stability. Tuition is billed in one installment due before the first day of Behavioral Health 101

Full Payment is due on or before the first day of class and is non-refundable after the first day of class. Deferred payment plans are not offered by the College.

If a student is unable to attend any class, the student has a duty to contact the instructor prior to the class to discuss the matter.
